Tuesday, January 8, 2013 – KAUFFMAN FOUNDATION CONFERENCE CENTER, 4801 ROCKHILL RD., KCMO 64110

3 Connecting with Nature at the Burroughs Audubon Nature Center and Library

Saturdays, Jan 5 – Feb 2 – Mar 2, 10:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. ~ Bird Banding with Dana Ripper and Ethan Duke of Missouri River Bird Observatory (Note: If weather is inclement, banding will be held on Sunday, January 6) Come see our resident winter songbirds up close and personal! Dana and Ethan will band and release birds for population studies and answer questions about their current research projects. Red-breasted Nuthatches have been caught two months in a row! Come see what turns up this winter. Banding will continue monthly on the first Saturday through March.

4 Field Trips

Lake Jacomo and Fleming Park with Mike and Elizabeth Stoakes

Tuesday, January 1

Start the year with a bang! We'll meet at 7:30 a.m. in the parking lot of the Jackson County Parks and Recreation offices at the intersection of Liggett and Woods Chapel Roads (watch for traffic light at this 3-way intersection). We'll bird the lakes and trails throughout the park looking for winter residents and late migrants -- ducks, geese, sparrows, finches, eagles, hawks and, hopefully, some surprises! Be sure to dress for the weather and wear footwear for some light walking. If the weather is really cold, we'll warm up at the Burroughs Library. Questions? Longview Lake with Sherry Leonardo

Wednesday, January 9

Meet at 8:00 a.m. at the lake marina. We'll check for waterfowl around the marina then walk the bike trail looking for winter residents. We may also walk one or two other areas around the lake. Dress for the weather; hiking boots are recommended. Bring water and snacks. Note: walking may total 2-3 miles. Directions: From I-470 take the Raytown Rd. exit (exit 4). Drive south, approximately 1.6 miles, to Longview Rd. The entrance will be a left-hand turn at a stoplight with a sign for the marina. Wyandotte County Lake Park with John Bollin

Saturday, January 19

Take a break from the winter doldrums and join us to look for eagles, waterfowl and winter songbirds. Wyandotte County Lake is a jewel within the northwest KC metro area, and it can be a waterfowl magnet since the lake is closed to boating and fishing in the winter. Meet at 8:00 a.m. in the lower parking lot, just north of the F.L. Schlagle Library. After scanning the lake, we'll visit the Schlagle Library to view their feeders where Purple Finch and Spotted Towhee were present last winter. Lawrence, Clinton Reservoir and Perry Lake with Mark Land

Saturday, February 16

Join us as we travel to Lawrence and Perry, KS in search of winter songbirds and waterfowl. We'll check Clinton Reservoir, and Perry Lake for gulls, raptors, waterfowl, sparrows, shrikes, and finches. Bring all the usual items: binoculars, scopes, FRS radios, drinks, snacks, money for lunch (we may stop to warm up at a local lunch spot), and cold weather gear (lakes are always windy places). The Kansas City group will meet at 7:30 a.m. at the Wendy's at K-10 and Woodland Drive. If coming from other areas, contact Mark for a meeting spot in Lawrence. Call Mark at 913-381-4324 and leave a message if you plan to participate so that he can contact you if the trip is cancelled because of the weather. There is an entrance fee to Clinton Lake State Park if you don't have a KS Parks yearly permit. This is an all day trip, but you're welcome to participate as long as you like.

Burr Oak Woods Conservation Area and Lake Remembrance with Sara Scheil

Wednesday, February 20

Meet at 8:00 a.m. in the nature center parking lot. Sara will lead us around some of Burr Oak's beautiful trails in search of winter residents. Afterwards, we'll head to nearby Lake Remembrance to look for waterfowl. Dress for the weather, and bring water and snacks. Directions: from I-70 in Blue Springs, drive 1.25 miles north on MO Hwy 7 to NW Park Rd. Turn left, and go approximately 1.1 miles to the nature center parking lot. Join us at this regional birding hotspot where we'll look for waterfowl and gulls on the lake and lingering winter songbirds and early spring migrants on some of the trails. Great Salt Plains NWR - Jet, Oklahoma

Saturday, March 23 to Sunday, March 24

Join Burroughs Audubon friend, Gene Young, as he leads us around one of the largest saline flats in North America looking for waterfowl, waders, and shorebirds. The refuge has been designated as an Important Bird Area and is a critical Whooping Crane stopover during the fall and spring migrations. Travel and lodging on your own. Meet at refuge headquarters at 9:30 a.m. on Saturday morning. Refuge HQ is about 1.75 hours (100 miles) southwest of Wichita, KS via I-35 south, US Hwy 81 west-south, OK Hwy 11 west, and OK Hwy 38 south. Lodging in Cherokee (approx. 17 miles from refuge), Alva (approx. 31 miles from refuge), and Enid (approx. 50 miles from refuge). We've been informed that motels may be somewhat difficult to find because of occupancy by oil and gas workers in the area. Four cabins which will accommodate up to 4 adults each have been reserved at Great Salt Plains State Park (approx. 3 miles from refuge). First come, first served, and reservations will only be accepted for two, or more (up to 4), per cabin. Plan to lodge in OK on Saturday night (Friday night, March 22 advised, too).
