Short History of Burroughs Audubon

The Burroughs Nature Club was started by an enterprising book agent, a woman representative of Houghton Mifflin Co. She promoted the organization of Nature clubs and took orders for sets of books by John Burroughs, she canvassed the schools, seeking subscriptions and memberships.

The climax of her efforts in Kansas City was a highly advertised lecture on John Burroughs, given in the lecture room of the public library on April 15, 1919. Lula Van Nemen, biology teacher at Westport High School, was elected the first president. The early meetings had evening lectures on nature, astronomy, or other natural science topics.

After several years, membership dwindled. The club became affiliated with the National Audubon Society, following the reorganization of the Missouri State Audubon Society. More attention was given to field work and first hand observations, in addition to lectures. The group became a national chapter of the National Audubon Society in 1971, changing its name to the Burroughs Audubon Society.



GENERAL MEETINGS

General meetings begin promptly at 6:45 pm; refreshments served at 6:15 pm. Our winter/spring 2014 meetings will be held at the Anita B. Gorman Conservation Discovery Center, 4750 Troost Ave., Kansas City, MO 64110.

January 7, 2014: "The Owls of Forest Park". Mark Glenshaw, Missouri Master Naturalist, will describe his 8 years of study of Great Horned Owls in an urban St. Louis Park. His videos will illustrate the owls' feeding, hunting, nesting, and social behaviors. Don't miss this intimate look at one of Missouri's most fascinating raptors!

February 4, 2014: "A Wilderness Icon: America's Red Rock Wilderness". Clayton Daughenbaugh (conservation organizer of the Southern Utah Wilderness Alliance) will discuss the citizen-led, multiyear campaign to designate public lands in Utah's red rock canyons as part of the National Wilderness Preservation System. A short film will accompany

the talk and introduce us to the stark beauty of these areas, threatened by such activities as oil and gas exploration and inappropriate off-road vehicle use.

March 4, 2014: “Greening the Inner City: The Oxbow Project”.

Kate Corwin of GreenWorksKC will describe the restoration of bird habitat and native flora along the Brush Creek corridor in central Kansas City. Two local high school students will also discuss their contributions to the project, and Don Arney of BAS will give a summary of his seasonal bird censuses in the restored habitats. This project has been funded in part by grant money from TogetherGreen (a partnership between National Audubon Society and Toyota).

Located in the northwest KC metro area, Wyandotte County Lake can be a waterfowl magnet in winter. Meet at 8:00 a.m. in the lower parking lot, just north of the Mr. & Mrs. F.L. Schlagle Environmental Library. After birding around the lake, we'll return to the Schlagle Library to view feeders where Purple Finch and Spotted Towhee have been seen on previous trips. Wednesday, February 5 - Burr Oak Woods Conservation Area and Lake
